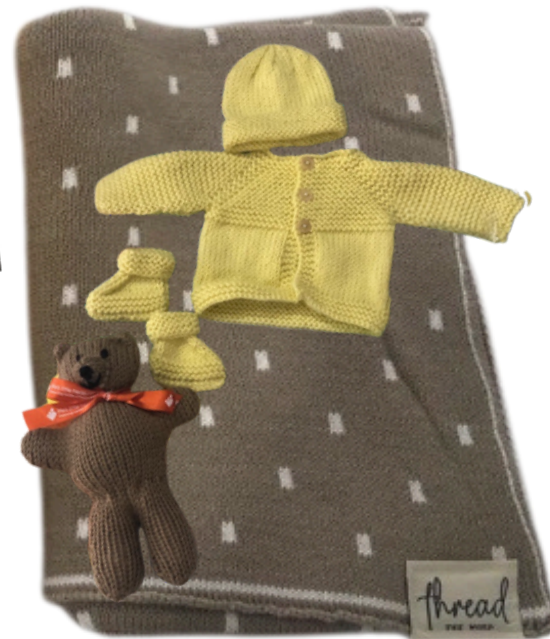

Keeping Families Together

Having a baby in hospital long term or located far away from home can mean that parents are not only dealing with the stress of caring for a baby in hospital but are also having to manage the financial pressures associated with travel, accommodation, and food in order to spend precious time with their baby.

We are proud to offer the Life's Little Treasures Foundation Family Assistance Program - a program which provides parents with financial assistance in the form of a \$100 EFTPOS voucher to ease some of their pressures and allow them to concentrate on spending their time cot-side, bonding and caring for their baby.



This voucher is included with a beautifully presented care package, including items for baby that have been lovingly handmade by our Craft Connections community of crafters and information for families.



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Application Process

Who can apply?

Hospital social worker or nominated health professional via our website.

Any conditions to meet?

Minimum of three of the following must be met:

Criteria

Baby/babies must be currently admitted to a neonatal intensive care unit (NICU) in an Australian tertiary hospital only.

The family is experiencing significant financial pressure because of the circumstances of their baby's early or unexpected hospital admission, such as:

- a parent or parents having to cease work earlier than expected
- the temporary relocation of the family to be closer to baby and hospital and the associated accommodation costs
- unplanned travel expenses (public or private transport costs)
- hospital or council parking fees

Baby was born prematurely at 30 weeks or earlier and requires an extended hospital admission (6 weeks or more).

Baby was born with a major health complication requiring an extended hospital admission (6 weeks or more).

Family have expressed concerns regarding financial pressure that is related to baby's hospital admission. This program is designed to support families who have been deemed ineligible (or are not yet eligible) for other interim crisis support and governmental support programs during their baby's hospital admission
